

Replacing the interface board

Replacement

1. Make sure that the power cord is unplugged.
2. Remove the 2 screws.
3. Remove the interface board unit in the direction of the arrow.
4. When the new board is RS-232C interface board unit, change the setting of the DIP Switches if necessary, referring to TSP600 User's Manual or TBD900 Specification Manual.
5. Slide the new interface board in until it is firmly seated.
Note: Insert the interface board so that it connects with the connector.
6. Secure the interface board using the two screws.
